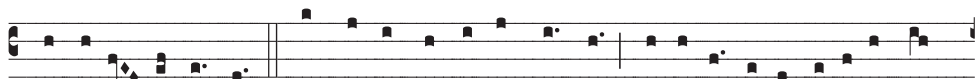

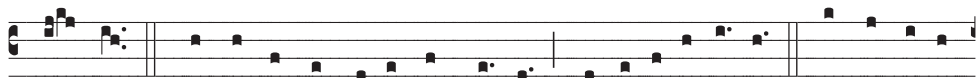

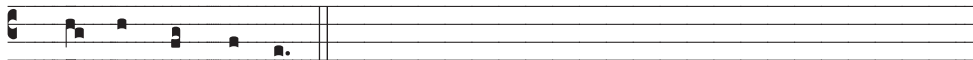

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH
