HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

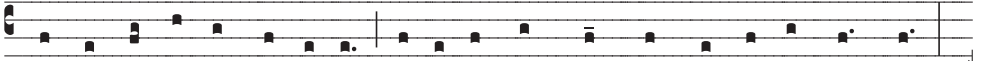
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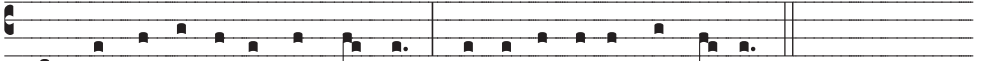
UR Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come,
