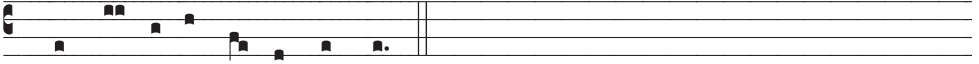

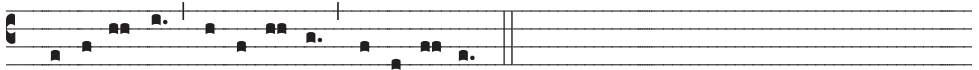

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH






